## **HURRICANE COORDINATION and WASTE REMOVAL**

## PMCDD COORDINATION WITH FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY AGENCIES

All coordination with federal, state, and county agencies shall be by the PMCDD Operations Manager or his designee.

<u>Information dissemination-</u> PMCDD staff shall disseminate pertinent information from any government agency to the Foundation of Pelican Marsh, Tiburon Homeowners association, Tiburon Golf Course, Pelican Marsh Golf Course, and Bay Colony Golf Course. The PMCDD shall not coordinate with individual HOA, unless information is requested from them.

## Post Hurricane Cleanup -

- a) The county shall make initial lane clearances within the PMCDD for District roads.
- b) Individual HOA and Golf Courses will be responsible for their Roads and will coordinate their cleanup with the county
- c) The PMCDD is responsible to clean up only the PMCDD properties which include District roads and District commons areas.
- d) Horticultural waste removal- Horticultural waste removed from District properties shall be staged around the PMCDD operations bldg. If additional horticultural waste storage is required the overflow waste shall be stored between the west end of the tennis courts and the Goodlette Road abutment, which is Foundation and County property. In exchange for use of the Foundation property, the PMCDD shall prioritize cleanup of the Foundation parking lot and tennis courts, after the district roads are cleared. After the District commons areas are cleared, then the PMCDD shall clear the Foundation commons areas. The overflow horticultural waste shall get priority for removal prior to removing the waste around the PMCDD Operations Building

## FEMA compensation

While clean up related cost is a major compensation issue from FEMA, other areas may have some compensation. Documentation in the form of photos, billings, and other paperwork is critical for compensation. All areas of compensation requested require explanations.
